<u>February 3</u> <u>**Richard L. Rose</u>** will discuss his experience while participating in a World Banking program prior to and on Dec. 1, 1991, the date of the succession of the Ukraine from the USSR, and one month before the end of the cold war that ended on Dec. 31, 1991. His assistance included advising the Ukraine to obtain bids for the remediation of the Chernobyl nuclear disaster; assuring Ukrainian commercial and agricultural organizations to do business with the US; and to understand the basic laws of the capitalistic system of doing business.</u>

<u>February 10</u> <u>Kathleen Holland</u> is the Director of Inland Wetlands and Watercourses for New Canaan and has 28 years of municipal land use experience. In 2009, she received the "Wetlands Director of the Year Award" from the Connecticut Association of Conservation and Inland Wetlands Commission. Her presentation will cover the purpose and importance of wetland protection, roles and responsibilities of the Wetland Commission, challenges faced by the staff and the Commission and a review of interesting projects on the horizon.
