- Mar 4 Our speaker will be Joseph F. Pisani, a Principal of The Dilenschneider Group. Mr. Pisani has more than 30 years of experience in journalism, community relations and media product development. He has held editorial positions at metropolitan papers, including the *St. Petersburg Times* in Florida and *Newsday* on Long Island, but for much of his career, Mr. Pisani was editor and senior vice president of *The (Stamford) Advocate* and *Greenwich Time*, daily newspapers in Fairfield County, Conn. He continues to write a weekly column for the Hersam Acorn newspaper chain in Southern Connecticut.
- Mar 11 Our own SMC member Dr. Paul Strassmann will give us an update on some new activities in the Department of Defense Cyber Warfare Command, as well as a review of some new unmanned weapons. Paul is Distinguished Professor of Computer Science at the George Mason University, former Director of Defense Information at the Office of the Secretary of Defense and former Chief Information Officer of NASA.
- Mar 18 Eric Metaxas, the author of *Bonhoeffer, Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy* will speak on how Rev. Dietrich Bonhoeffer opposed Hitler for years and, just before Germany fell, was executed on Hitler's direct order. Mr. Metaxas was the editor of the Yale Record. His humor writing was first published in the Atlantic Monthly, and has appeared in The New York Times. Eric's book and movie reviews, essays, and poetry have appeared in The New York Times and The Washington Post. Metaxas has been frequently featured as a cultural commentator on CNN and the Fox News Channel. He authored *Amazing Grace*, which became the acclaimed movie of the same name.
- Mar 25 Mitchell Krauss will address "The Middle East Today An Overview." Mr. Krauss was a CBS News Correspondent for 25 years, including a stint as Middle East Correspondent, based in Cairo. From Egypt he travelled widely through the area, including Oman, Saudi Arabia, Israel and Sudan. He was at the scene when Sadat was gunned down. Prior to CBS, he was with Channel 13 in New York, where he anchored "Newsfront." Since leaving CBS, Mr. Krauss has chaired the Ambassador's Roundtable of the World Affairs Forum in Stamford where he and his wife have lived for the past 48 years.
