- Apr 6 No meeting. Good Friday.
- Apr 13 Our SMC member Dr. Paul Strassmann, a WWII veteran and former chief computer executive of Xerox, the Department of Defense and NASA will speak about the rapid pace of development of techniques for interfering with military command and control communications. The presentation will conclude with guidance what measures to take to function in the era of cyber warfare without incurring personal damage Dr. Strassmann is presently teaching two graduate level courses on cyber operations and serves as the monthly contributing editor to the journal of the Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association.
- Apr 20 Alan Donaldson will speak on trusts and estates and related areas. The negative effect that the new Connecticut laws, reflecting our poor financial condition, have had on the Connecticut Estate and Gift Tax laws is something that should be of interest to all of us. Alan P. Donaldson graduated with honors both from Princeton University in 1970 and Northwestern University School of Law in 1973, where he served on the Editorial Board of the Law Review. He received a Master of Laws in Taxation from New York University in 1980 and was admitted to practice in Connecticut and before the Federal District Court for the District of Connecticut.
- Apr 27 Dr. Christopher Chivvis will address us. Dr. Chivvis is a political scientist at the RAND Corporation and adjunct professor at the Johns Hopkins, Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies. Dr. Chivvis, who grew up in New Canaan, will speak about a year spent in the Office of the Secretary of Defense where he was the Eurasia Security Strategy Officer. He was involved with missile defense cooperation, NATO-Russia relations, and the Russia-Georgia conflict. Dr. Chivvis has published numerous articles, op-ed pieces and books. He received the Office of the Secretary of Defense Outstanding Achievement Award.

- Apr 19 (Thu) The first is a visit to the Wadsworth Atheneum. You will tour the Atheneum's featured exhibits: Colts & Ouilts: The Civil War Remembered, an exhibition of costumes, decorative arts and paintings, and Andrew Wyeth: Looking Beyond, a collection of paintings, drawings and preparatory studies. The price will be \$75. Your day will include lunch at the Chowderpot in Hartford, a one hour docent-led tour of the featured exhibits, and time to visit other collections in the Museum.
- The second will be a trip to the Metropolitan Museum. The Metropolitan Museum's collection of May 1 (Tue) American Art reopened their New American Wing Galleries for Paintings, Sculpture, and Decorative Arts on January 16 after a \$100 million restoration. Other special exhibits will be Rembrandt and Degas: Portrait of the Artist as a Young Man, The Dawn of Egyptian Art, and several others. The price will be \$30, which is only for your bus trip. You will be dropped off at the Museum door and picked up 3-1/2 hours later.
- May 29 (Tue) We'll be visiting the New York Botanical Garden in Bronx, N.Y. The day includes a private, docent-led tram tour followed by a catered buffet lunch in a private area of the Visitor Center Café. After lunch, we'll have time to visit the Haupt Conservatory or just wander around the Garden. The Enid A. Haupt Conservatory is featuring a stunning tribute to French Impressionist Claude Monet that showcases a seasonally changing interpretation of the gardens that inspired his art.
