- July 12 Martin Yellin's talk is titled: "Hexagon: The Top Secret Program That Helped Prevent WWIII". He retired in 1998 after working at Perkin Elmer in Wilton for 33 years, was involved with the Hexagon program to design and build the largest spy satellite ever to be flown in space. He couldn't talk about it for 40 years until reclassified in 2011. During his last 10 years at Perkin Elmer, Martin helped design and manage parts of the Hubble Space Telescope--the most productive space instrument ever built. Makes you want to ask: "What's next?"
- July 26 Dede Locke, BSN, RN has worked as an oncology nurse since 1981 and is a member of Mid Fairfield Hospice where she has provided in-home, professional care for the last 5 years.
