October 6 Dr. Brian Luizzi, New Canaan Superintendent of Schools, will be talking about the "State of New Canaan Schools. He began his career as a teacher in Newtown High School, progressing through increasing a dminstrative responsibilities until he became in 2011 the Principal of New Canaan High School. In 2014, he was named Superintendent of NC Schools. Throughout his professional career he has been involved in higher education at both the high school and college levels.

October 13 Dr. Ofer Wellisch, MD, MPH, is Chief of Pain Management at Stamford Hospital. The subject of his talk will be "Opioids – The Good and the Bad", involving both the positive medical power of opioids as well at their addictive properties when the drug is used improperly. He returned to the East Coast to a medical practice at Mt Sanai-Icahn School of Medicine.
